Highlights: 5th World Bank Mission

World Bank mission visited Gujarat during June 27th to 01st July, 2016 to carry out the fifth implementation support and supervision mission for the Second Gujarat State Highway Project (GSHP II). The mission met the officials from the R&BD, the PIU, as well as contractors and consultants working on the project and visited the sites of ongoing civil works contracts. The highlights of the mission proceedings are:

Kick-off Session on 27th June 2016:

The World Bank Mission Members were warmly welcomed by Secretary R&BD, Shri P. J. Patel, Chief Engineer (WB) Shri P. R. Patelia and PIU. The session started with R&BD's presentation on status and progress of the project.





The Task Leader of World Bank, appreciated the turnaround progress in the civil work contracts compared to previous missions. Discussions were held on Road safety (SCDP) on day one.

Site Visit on 28th June:

The WB team along with PIU-R&BD, PMC and CSC visited the sites to see the progress and quality of work done on Atkot-Paliyad and Atkot-Gondal Corridor, (NCB-3).

The WB team along with PIU-R&BD, PMC and CSC visited the site to see the progress and quality of works done and EMP implementation on Dhansura-Meghraj NCB-7, Bayad-Dhoridungri (NCB-2A) and Lunawada-Khedapa (NCB-8)

Turnaround Phase


The overall project and specifically the Civil Works component of GSHP-II registered a turnaround. It is identified as the outcome of collective efforts of R&BD and all the stakeholders including the World Bank team. Integrated Project Co-ordination & Management and three tiered review meetings came out as 'the mantra' behind the turnaround.

Civil Works

GSHP-II followed the mechanism of triparty (PIU-PMC, CSC and Contractor) and three tier approach (PIU, CE-WB and Secretaryto review, monitor the progress and motivate the stakeholders towards accomplishment of targets. Meetings were rescheduled as weekly, normally every Monday. In such weekly meetings, PIU made an effort to closely monitor the contracts, identify bottlenecks in early stage and took swift actions to resolve them. At the same time, it engaged itself in following up on continuous basis. Enroute, when required, it identified slow progress packages and were visited by top management of R&BD including Secretary-R&BD. While getting feedback of works and targets, realistic plans were set on roll by active support from PIU. While all this was happening, every agency was advised to consider and made to factor quality, safety and environmental safeguards in overall planning, execution and delivery. Such framework and commitment of time enabled the R&BD to identify and resolve even the smallest problems at an early stage. Indeed the positive environment creation and raising the spirits of agencies served the purpose at both ends. Focus of this combined effort was everyone addressing expedition, coming out with solutions to resolve and move forward.


Monitoring of safeguards is also improved through integrated approach with continuous efforts of PIU, PMC, CSC and the contractors.

Integrated Monitoring and Three Tiered Review:



The financial progress during the last six months was INR 138 Cr as compared to INR 93Cr as observed during previous six months. Thus improvement in progress during this period was 1.5 times.






